<p><b>6977</b></p>	<p><b>Minutes of Town Council meetings held on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2011</b>                  The Minutes of the Town Council meeting on the above date were <b><u>unanimously approved</u></b> and signed as a true record.</p>
<p><b>6978</b></p>	<p><b>Matters Arising</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minute 6958 (March 11) – The Conservative Club has informed the Town Council that it has a ‘right of access’ (lifetime agreement) from Desborough High Street to the Conservative Club car park with the owner of the land but no maintenance agreement. The Conservative Club wrote to the owner of the land, Downell Construction Ltd, in December 2009 asking for the potholes to be repaired. The</li> </ul>

	<p>owner of the company telephoned the Conservative Club and stated that he had no intention of doing anything to the road until the land next to it is developed (owned by the same Company). He said he was happy for the Conservative Club to undertake repairs. However, their insurance company has advised against making repairs as the Club will then become liable. It was <b>RESOLVED</b> that the Town Council will write to the Enforcement Officer at KBC copied to the owner of the land.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minute 6966 (March 11) – Mr Conway, Head of Housing KBC, has confirmed that new gas-fired central heating systems will be installed in the bungalows in Victoria Street and High Street during May. Transco will install a new gas supply at the end of April.</li> </ul>
<p><b>6979</b></p>	<p><b>Representations from members of the public</b>  The Town Council was asked a number of questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Will Conservative support for the Sainsbury’s bid continue after the election?</li> <li>• With the reported delay of the Tesco planning application will the Town Council still support the Sainsbury’s planning application if it is considered first?</li> <li>• Does the Town Council see support for two supermarkets a real regeneration for the Town?</li> <li>• Does the Town Council want Desborough to be a dormitory town or a supermarket town?</li> <li>• The Heritage Centre and Civic Society were promised new accommodation on the Lawrence Factory Site.</li> </ul> <p>Councillors made the following comments in respect to the above-detailed questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Town Council has previously minuted (Minute 6949.3/Feb 11) that it has no objection to the Sainsbury’s planning application as long as the Lawrence Site is dealt with first. When the Lawrence Site solution has been approved and ceases to be available the Town Council will fully support the development of Sainsbury's on Magnetic Park;</li> <li>• It was noted that the above decision was made by the Town Council and is not a party political statement. It is not appropriate for political issues in respect of the forthcoming election to be discussed at the Town Council meeting;</li> <li>• Until a planning application is approved by KBC for the Lawrence Factory Site no decision can be made about a supermarket to be situated on the Grange. This is based on previous Government policy which still stands;</li> <li>• With the advent of an additional 700 houses at the Grange there will be a need for another supermarket;</li> <li>• The Town Council has argued for many years that it does not want a dormitory town. It is hoped that the future Council will continue this fight;</li> <li>• The minutes from the Town Council meeting in March 2011 (Minute 6955 – Site Specific Proposals Local Development Document) were referred to which shows the Town Council’s support for new and existing manufacturing within the Town;</li> <li>• The KBC plans for mixed use Lawrence Factory Site to include the Heritage Centre, Marlow House and the Library amongst other uses were an aspiration. However, until a developer submits a planning application which is approved by KBC then it is not confirmed. A planning application of this nature has not been submitted by a developer to date. The only plans submitted to the Town Council for comment from KBC were from a Housing Association to build flats which was not supported. The minutes from the Town Council meeting in March 2011 (Minute 6955) note that the Heritage Centre requires a permanent home.</li> </ul>

	<p>An altercation took place between a member of the public and Cllr Durward. The member of the public who had asked questions of the Council was asked by the Chairman if he had anything else to say once his questions had been answered. The member of the public stated that he had nothing else to say as it is clear that the Council's position had not changed. Cllr Durward stated that this was a stupid thing to say and that he had, had enough of the stupidity that had gone on in the year. The member of the public stated that he was offended to be called stupid and asked for the statement to be retracted.</p> <p>Cllr Goodman thanked the members of the public for attending the meeting.</p>
<p><b>6980</b></p>	<p><b>Hawthorns Working Group - Update</b>  Cllr Soans reported that he had been asked to call a meeting of the original members of the Hawthorns Working Group which was held on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2011. Cllr Soans highlighted the concerns raised by members of the Group at the meeting.</p> <p>It was <b><u>RESOLVED</u></b> that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Hawthorns Working Group be dissolved and that an independent Steering Group is established with the DCDT as an umbrella organisation;</li> <li>• Desborough Town Council has a representative on the Steering Group and that members of the dissolved Working Group will be welcome to join the new Steering Group.</li> </ul> <p>It was <b><u>AGREED</u></b> that the Town Council continue to support keeping the Hawthorns Leisure Centre open and that a Town Council representative will be decided upon at May's meeting.</p> <p>An email has been received from Mr Warden, Desborough Community Development Trust (DCDT), to ask for any outstanding Hawthorns Petitions to be returned to the DCDT shop as soon as possible. It was noted that the petition was due to be presented to KBC Full Council meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2011. However, concern was raised that this meeting has been cancelled 'due to lack of business'.</p>
<p><b>6981</b></p>	<p><b>Kettering Old Grammar School Foundation</b>  Cllr Soans gave a talk on the history of the Foundation, its' purpose, the outward bound centre it owns, financial support granted to institutions and bursaries awarded to gifted and talented young people across Kettering Borough. Further information can be found on their website at <a href="http://www.kogsf.org.uk">www.kogsf.org.uk</a></p> <p>It was noted that grant applications have been received from virtually all schools across the Borough with the exception of Desborough schools.</p>
<p><b>6982</b></p>	<p><b>Desborough – Corby Bus Service</b>  The Town Council has not yet received a response from Stagecoach's Commercial Manager, Mr C Simes, to attend a Town Council meeting. It was <b><u>AGREED</u></b> that this item will be placed on the Agenda for May.</p> <p>NCC Have Your Say: Proposed Changes to Public Transport &amp; Bus Subsidies – it was <b><u>AGREED</u></b> that Cllr Coe will respond to this consultation on behalf of the Town Council.</p>

6983	<p><b>War Memorial</b></p> <p>Cllr Bindley reported that she had attended a meeting on behalf of the Town Council as a request has been received by KBC to put a plaque in the flower garden behind the War Memorial to commemorate 70 years of Desborough Aerodrome (2013) and all the RAF personnel stationed there. The Town Council <b>AGREED</b> that it has no objection to this request although concern was raised that more requests may be received.</p> <p>It was noted that permission has been requested by Mr Warden, Poppy Appeal Organiser, for the creation of a Field of Remembrance on the grassed area immediately behind the War Memorial. Permission will need to be granted by KBC and not the Town Council. It was <b>RESOLVED</b> to write to KBC to confirm the Town Council's support for the Field of Remembrance.</p>
6984	<p><b>Website Development</b></p> <p>Councillors were invited to comment on the 'mock' website design and content. Vision ICT Ltd will provide a further day of training to the Clerk and will arrange to meet with the Town Council following the elections to provide a presentation on the website and the facilities that can be used, such as, on-line voting and questionnaires. Training will also be provided to organisations that manage their own page(s) on the website.</p>

Cllr Goodman confirmed that this issue has been raised with Mr D Lane, KBC, who has confirmed that the turf has now been removed (it had died due to lack of water) and the relevant areas seeded;</li> <li>• Continued concerns have been received about the smell in the Harborough Road area. It was <b>RESOLVED</b> to contact the Environmental Health Department to request a report on the situation;</li> <li>• The feeder road off Pevrel Place has been named Shakerspear Way which appears to be spelt incorrectly and bears no relation to the other road names in this area. **KET/2010/0828 – Mr Malde Malde Holdings – 7 Station Road, Desborough – Full Application: Change of use from dance hall to wedding venue and conferencing centre.**

Desborough Town Council fully supports this planning application. The revitalisation of this community asset is to be applauded.

<p>6990.3</p>	<p><b>KET/2010/0800 – Mr Gaskin c/o Derbyshire Gypsy Liaison Group – Greenfields, Great Oxendon Road, Braybrooke - Full Application: Change of use from agricultural land to a residential Gypsy site with 3 no. pitches and facilitating development.</b>                  Desborough Town Council totally rejects this planning application. There is more than enough Traveller Sites in the North of the Borough including the official one at The Pastures.                   Planning permission has already been granted for an additional ten pitches at The Pastures which satisfies the identified need for the North of the Borough. Eight additional pitches are needed in the South of the Borough.                   This is situated on a green field site and has a current enforcement order which it is understood follows on from a number of enforcement orders over a period of at least ten years. It is believed that pitches are still currently being sold across the site which consists of seven occupied pitches which are not the three being applied for.                   It is understood that the Utilities Statement is incorrect as the owner of the nearby kennels was allegedly (fairly) recently offered £1,000 by the occupants of the Gypsy Site for them to be allowed to use the mains water to the kennels. This was reported by the owner of the kennels to a KBC Planning Meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2011.                   Due to the nature, sensitivity and local importance of this Planning Application Desborough Town Council request that it be 'called in' to be discussed at a Full Planning Committee to ensure a transparent process.                   A Traveller and Gypsy Information Note (April 2011) received from KBC had been distributed to Councillors prior to the meeting.</p>
<p>6990.4</p>	<p><b><i>It was noted that KET/2011/0092(Minute 6948.4/March 11) – Midlands Co-Operative Society Ltd – 113A Braybrooke Road, Desborough - Advertisement Application: 1 no illuminated fascia sign. 3 no window graphics. KBC has granted permission for this application (08/04/11).</i></b>                  This planning application was considered by the Town Council however attached to it were two other applications:  <b>KET/2011/0093 – Midlands Co-Operative Society Ltd – 2 High Street, Desborough – Advertisement Application: 1 no. illuminated fascia sign. 3 no. vinyl sign. KBC has granted permission for this application (04/04/11).</b>  <b>KET/2011/0095 – Midlands Co-Operative Society Ltd – Station Road, Desborough – Advertisement Application: 2 no. illuminated fascia sign. 2. The Town council has no objection to these planning applications as it has improved the street scene. The Town Council however strongly object to the fact that the Co-Op have put up the signs before planning permission has been granted by KBC.</p> <p><b>KET/2010/0726 (Minute 6904.2/Dec 10) – Miss Boksh – 72 Station Road, Desborough – Full Application: Change of use from dwelling to ground floor restaurant and first floor bedsit, with two storey rear extension.</b> Cllr Goodman reported that this Planning Application has not yet been resolved with Kettering Borough Council. The plans propose to remove the bay window however KBC want the window to remain. There is also an issue with regard to the need to use shutters. Cllr Goodman has suggested that Miss Boksh write to KBC including photographic evidence of the number of premises that use shutters along Station Road and High Street as well as highlighting recent damage that has occurred to premises without shutters.
