Vision & Purpose of the Neighbourhood Plan


- Neighbourhood planning enables communities to play a much stronger role in shaping the areas in which they live and work and in supporting or opposing onerous new development proposals

- Improve transport links, amenities, recreation, green space
- Foster local economy & community involvement

Key Positives & Opportunities

- Desborough is a community with a rich heritage a neighbourhood plan could enhance local pride
- We have a wealth of natural spaces which enhance the quality of Life in the town. – It is well known that green spaces enhance wellbeing and biodiversity
- We have a major strategic location

- The right plan would increase the potential for local growth – new housing, in the correct area, and business could attract investment





Current Challenges

- We do not currently have a planner/ consultant onboard – this will significantly slow progress, it also limits technical planning capacity as the Town Council are not technically qualified – we are seeking alternative quotes
- Loss of Government funding funding for neighbourhood plans were withdrawn this year, the cost will have to be funded via reserves or additional precept
- Risk of delay & missed opportunities may stall local growth and infrastructure improvements
- Balancing growth vs preserving character – protect heritage and nature amid development
